Republican Abraham Lincoln was possibly our first "environmental" President as he created the Department of Agriculture in 1862 and also passed a bill protecting




the Yosemite Valley in 1864. All while fighting the Civil War and freeing the slaves!

Republican Teddy Roosevelt created the National Wildlife Refuge System that placed 230 million acres of land under federal protection in 1903 and set the stage for the future national parks system created by Democrat Woodrow Wilson in 1916.

Republican Richard Nixon actually goes down in history as possibly the most effective environmental president of all time. In 1970 he signed the Clean Air Act while also establishing the Environmental Protection Agency (which is so hated today by the inheritors of his party).

And with a GLUT in world oil at the moment... and prices so low that they can't support U.S. production... Sarah Palin is STILL.... at a Trump Rally... shouting...


"DRILL BABY DRILL!"

As if anyone conserving fossil fuels could not possibly take the position of supporting the troops fighting and dying to protect America's channels through which that same fuel was being delivered. We have now unfortunately become a nation where political positions now dictate beliefs far beyond the voting booth.

These political manipulations, combined with a fear of the unknown, and a strong resistance to "change", have today resulted in a majority of Americans not believing that man is the cause of the earth's rapidly increasing climate change.

A 2009 survey of "earth scientists" by the University of Illinois revealed that although 97% of the climatic scientists in America believe that man is responsible for climate change, only 41% of Americans believe it true.

In 2011 a study by the Pew Research Center of major industrialized countries shows only Russia and China having a smaller percentage of their citizens believing that climate change is an important issue. But the chart above shows the percentages of the population that believe in climate change country.

Why are we at the bottom of the list?

Beyond the obvious success of moneyed, special-interest lobbying... and powerful media outlets such as Fox News and right wing radio... Americans have also been numbed into complacency by steady streams of viral emails and questionable "facts" spread online.
